A brass band from the ship played hymns as the children watched with rapt attention over seeing these instruments for the first time! Stephen preached the gospel message and encouraged the hearts of many Outer Islanders, Palauans, and Yapese people who had come. We are thankful that God was in control all along. He really blessed us with Stephen and other friends from the U.S.N.S. Brunswick. during this uncertain time. Pastor Petrus is still in the hospital. Please pray with us for him to get well.
