The Lord had answered his prayer to return to pastoring a church, and to PMA/PMF who he left seven years ago. He missed the ministry and all the people he worked with. We also, as a family rejoiced because it was with PMA/PMF that we grew in our faith! November 1, we all woke up early to prepare for church worship service. We started with children's Sunday school and the adult Sunday worship. Many people who came were blessed as they were hungry for the Word of God and were praying for the PMF church to start at this place! We thank God that the Barrio Captain allowed us to use the Center for our services in the meantime. Thank You, Lord! BAHAY KALINGA ORPHANAGE, NAUJAN, MINDORO, PHILIPPINES. Praises from our Social Worker, **Ann Caspe:** "We pray for and thank everyone who have been supporting Bahay Kalinga from day 1, from 1991 – for 33 years! How we thank God for all those who regularly send their support in kind and finances. We thank God for all the Caregivers for their sacrifices and love for the children. We still continue to pray for a Center Head as we need to "process" children for adoption. Lately, we have had a volunteer in BK. Kuya Von (one of our caregivers' husband) helped clean the yard by cutting down trees, cleaning and removing the grass outside the fence, repairing broken things in BK. The Lord bless him!

REPUBLIC OF PALAU. The people who have lived in Palau for a long time always say that January has the worst weather, and that has proven very true this year. The bad weather has led to a heavy workload since the boats have not been able to make it to and from Angaur about 90% of the time. During this time of no boats, we have had the honor of flying home the caskets of two important members of the Angaur community and their families who had flown in from all over the world for the funeral. We have also had an unusual number of sea searches over the past month. A construction worker, a diver, and two fishermen got lost at sea, and we were called to conduct searches for them. These have all been heavy situations, but God sustains us and gives us encouragement to continue. We are so thankful for God's help finding the lost fishermen! Their boat had overturned on the reef, and they were so happy to see us! We were able to send the coordinates and help the boats reach them for rescue just as night was falling.
