Dear Praying Friends and Faithful Partners,

“...But David strengthened himself in the LORD his God.” 1 Samuel 30:6

What do you do when everything you had – your family and property have all been taken away from you? On top of that, your men blame you and want to stone you, as they too lost everything? That is exactly what David was going through in 1 Samuel 30. Through all these, David realized that even if everything was lost – one truth remained, the Lord was with him, and so he found strength in this. David was able to strengthen himself in the Lord because he knew God personally. For us, to strengthen ourselves in the Lord would mean that we remind ourselves of what Scripture says about God and His promises and then we apply those truths to our current situation. PALAU. From **Mike and Nadia Hammond**: God has really been moving through our activities here in Palau. We are planning a VBS this July, and we are excited to partner up with a local church for the event. The last month, we had three people come to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior. We are excited to see what doors and opportunities that God will open up for us in the near future.

YAP, MICRONESIA. The outer islands of Yap range from 100 miles away to 500 miles. Most of these islands don’t have runways and depend on a supply ship to bring food and fuel. There is a ship designated to the State of Yap to make regular runs to the outer islands, but it has been down for over a year. This summer, already starting in April, we have noticed an unusually high

amount of traffic flying with us. It has been reinforced in my mind how essential PMA is here in the islands providing safe transportation, food supply, and medical evacuations for these isolated communities. It has also been a blessing that we currently have three pilots and 3 airworthy planes to provide reliable support. This has made everything run so smoothly. We continue to praise God for his protection in all of our flights.

Summertime for our PMF church is always a busy time of year, as we are heavily involved in running a Youth Retreat and VBS. This year we took on a little extra. A team from the Ferguson's home church came out to help with Outreach and Biblical training seminars. This coincided with a VBS that we do each year for the outer island community. So in the mornings, we have VBS for 80-100 kids ages 6-12. Then, once that is done, in the afternoon, we roll into 3 back to back sessions where the gospel message is presented. Our target group has been people who usually live on the outer islands, but have come in to the main island for the summer. There are also those from Ulithi who expressed interest in learning from the Bible, and we flew them in to participate in this conference. Our first night was tonight and it was a blessing to see a good turnout and a clear presentation of the gospel to eager ears. Our prayer is that many seeds will be planted, many hearts will turn to Him, and those who know Him will strengthen their foundations. By: **Amos Collins**

POHNPEI, MICRONESIA. One day before we left for Arizona to attend our daughter Nadya's wedding, the antennae for the radio station failed. A few days after we returned Nob was able to temporarily fix the problem while the parts were ordered. Sometimes you don't realize how much you love and appreciate something until it is gone. .
