Dear Praying Friends and Faithful Partners,

*"The men were amazed and asked, "What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey him!" Matthew 8:27*

Reading this verse reminded me anew of how great, powerful and awesome our Lord Jesus Christ is! Yes, He is the only One who qualifies to be described and called "Awesome". No one and nothing else in this world compares with Him. I was impressed once more by this passage of scripture as it applies to our lives today - that although we can be overwhelmed by circumstances around us – we can be assured that our Lord Jesus is "in the boat" with us and His presence is enough to give us peace and assurance that He is with us and would calm the storms in our lives.

**GUAM.** The doctrine of a Triune God is not an easy subject to understand even for adults. Approximately 600 children were reached during this endeavor. The theme of the VBS was "Fearless – Standing Boldly for God!" Headed by Teacher Mercy (for over-all outreach) and Dadine Lumigis for Jomalig, volunteers from each church travelled by land and sea to be able to minister to the children. We pray for the children who have given their lives to the Lord, that they would continue to grow in Him and influence their family and friends as well. Pray that they will start attending church and get nourishment during Sunday school.

**BAHAY KALINGA ORPHANAGE, NAUJAN, MINDORO.** Jeny Flores-Gutierrez is very glad to share that 9 of our children were dedicated to the Lord! Praise the Lord for these young lives – may they grow to know and to be like Jesus! We also found a place for JL, he will be transferring to another facility who can take care of his special needs. **PALAU. Mike Hammond** shares: “We are glad to be back in Palau after our wonderful vacation to Africa. We had a great time seeing Nadia's side of the family and going on safaris. I was also able to complete some medical appointments in Guam. The church here is functioning well, and growing. We will be starting an out-reach to the island of Angaur starting 10 July. I will be paring up with our pilots, and flying to Angaur in order to start a Bible study there. God is good!”

**YAP, MICRONESIA.** “The month of May was filled with rather unusual flying activity,” shares **Simon Hammerling**, “While Amos and Lance were flying surveillance in Palau a request came in for their a medicine drop in Eauripik for a young woman. I want to praise the Lord that the IV fluids survived the air drop with the parachutes. Eauripik doesn't have a runway that's why PMA flew to drop medicine for the patient while a boat from the government was dispatched to pick her up.

On Saturday May 20<sup>th</sup> a dear friend of ours in Ulithi passed away. Evie was our agent in Ulithi. She received the bookings and helped coordinate the flight schedule from Ulithi. The day of her funeral, Pastor Petrus and wife Queen, Amos, Lance and I decided to use this as an opportunity to witness to the community. We took a few members of the family along and flew to Ulithi. Petrus had a chance to share God's word in front of the community and people were paying attention. My heart is broken for Tony who lost his wife and his best friend and I want to ask you to pray with me for him and his personal relationship with Jesus.”

**POHNPEI, MICRONESIA.** Why are we teaching young children about God? With this initial question we started our Sunday School Teachers' meeting. Psalm 78 gives us the direction in verse 7 “so that each generation should set its hope anew on God, not forgetting His glorious miracles and obeying His commands.” God does not have grandchildren – we do not inherit our faith, every person in every generation needs to be taught and make the decision him/herself.
