A group of more than 30 adults and more than 20 children meet in a make-shift worship center under a tarp between two houses. They listened intently, as the Word of God encouraged and uplifted them. But you know, all of us who visited them that morning were the ones blessed by their commitment, faithfulness and perseverance! They are giving themselves fully to the work of the Lord! **PHILIPPINES.** This was my first trip to the Philippines together with the PMA team. We visited the remote Eastern islands of Patnanungan and Jomalig. I met the PMF pastors and their wives who ardently pursue their goal of winning their fellow islanders for Christ. Their living conditions are rather simple; some do not have power or running water. They need to walk far for potable water. I walked on muddy paths that swallowed my sandals, through the water to get to the boat and all the while thinking that these brothers and sisters in the Lord do that most every day. They are a source of inspiration in their endurance and confidence that the Lord has called them where they are located. YAP, MICRONESIA. This past month has had its share of illnesses among staff, but somehow with God's help we can continue on with the work here.
