We thank God for His protection and safety over our crew and for the continuance of the project despite bad weather. The Lord used friends of PMA to provide for the funding of this Project. BAHAY KALINGA ORPHANAGE, NAUJAN, ORIENTAL MINDORO. We are thankful for the visit of RACCO (Regional Alternative Child Care Office) of the National Authority for Child Care. It was good to meet with them as they came to monitor the case management of the children under our care. They reiterated their availability to provide technical assistance to us in order to strengthen the implementation of adoption and other alternative child care programs of BK. Their visit came at an opportune time as we have 3 children ready for adoption and temporary care children needing foster care. Please pray for our Social Worker, Ann Caspe for wisdom to process all these. Pray for the Lord to provide a Center Head as well.

REPUBLIC OF PALAU. PMA Palau is in the midst of some major upgrades to our aircraft. We are preparing to launch two of our staff members, Stephen and Monet Newton, to restart a PMA aviation base in Manila, Philippines. We want to equip them with the best possible aircraft to serve isolated people around the Philippines. The plane they are taking is receiving a complete avionics upgrade and auxiliary fuel tanks to

extend the range. Dale Liff and Jim Newman from Missionary Maintenance Service have travelled all the way from Ohio for over a month to help us accomplish the work. With all the other operational demands and maintenance projects, it is very helpful to have them here bringing their avionics expertise. Dave enjoyed the weekly flight to Palau and built strong friendships with our team down there as well. He will continue to serve with PMA while in the US as our Director of Flight Operations. He will also assist us in a minor role as recruiter for PMA whenever he has time. Dave will always be a good friend and his sense of humor and easy going flexible attitude will be missed.

POHNPEI, MICRONESIA. One of the challenges of being a career missionary comes to us when we want and need to care for our elderly parents, yet live thousands of miles away on the mission field. It's a challenge and another opportunity to trust in God's timing and sovereign guidance. One day at a time, we walk by faith not by sight. For Nob's mother Elizabeth, we cared for her in Pohnpei until she went to heaven in 2020. This year I faced the challenge of my dear mother Lilli, who had a bilateral stroke in February. I quickly dropped everything and flew to Texas to care for her. Mom was hospitalized in 3 different locations until we were able to take her to her home. Initially, she was receiving rehab and getting stronger and then some other complications set in and rehab was no longer an option. We decided on hospice care in her home as the decline was happening rapidly. On April 12, 2023, my dear mother crossed the finish line and was escorted to heaven by God's angels. How thankful we are that I could be with her as life here on earth ended.
