Dear Praying Friends and Faithful Partners,

Recently, the PMA family and in particular, our Director for Aviation Maintenance, Simon Hammerling, went through the tragic and senseless loss of his wife. This has brought a lot of sorrow, pain and questions – Why? Why did this tragedy happen? Why would anyone do such an atrocious act? Why did God allow this? During this difficult time we find rest in God alone. The Truth remains that He is in control even when circumstances are difficult to understand. Through grief, hurt and distress, our Lord Jesus Christ has made us to understand that trusting in Him requires unanswered questions in this life. We believe our Shepherd will guide us through this darkness. His sustaining grace, strength and His unchanging Word with promises that never fail, the support of family and many friends, have been such a great comfort.

YAP, MICRONESIA. Our hearts are heavy and broken as we share this news: On the evening of October 14th, PMA pilot Simon Hammerling's wife Rachelle Bergeron, the Acting AG for Yap State, was shot outside their home while returning from a run. Simon and Deesha (the Yapese girl they were caring for) and Rachelle's family had their lives changed forever in an instant. They lost a wife, a mother figure, a daughter, sister, and countless others have lost a good friend in Rachelle. She was beautiful inside and out; a fearless advocate for the powerless, and possessed a true servant's heart. She was an exceptional woman. Her memorial service in Yap was attended by hundreds of people who had been touched by her life and came to mourn with Simon and Rachelle's family in her death. We know that Rachelle loved the Lord, and is safe in His arms even now, but even so, we hurt for our brother Simon and Rachelle's family and friends, who have lost someone they loved so dearly. Please pray for them. The local law enforcement with the help of the FBI recently arrested two men and charged them with her murder. Please pray that justice will be done. ~ Heidi Collins
