Dear Praying Friends and Faithful Partners,

Every time I entered the foyer of our new Hangar in Palau – I was greeted with Dad’s (Pastor Edmund Kalau) picture and I would greet him! “Are you happy Dad? Your PMA vision and mission continues and we are living it!” Praise God for His faithfulness!

PHILIPPINES. One after the other, strong tropical typhoons “visited” our islands – Polillo, being the first one to be hit every time a typhoon comes because we are in its path all the time. With typhoon “Karding”, some of our Pastors’ homes and some of our churches were adversely affected – roofs and walls blew away and most of the neighbors’ dwellings as well. We are thankful no lives were lost! Our well-built churches in Jomalig, Apad and Guinaygayan were places of refuge – many families in the Villages came and sought shelter and our Pastors and their families were busy ministering to the people. PMA on Guam and our PMF churches in the islands were able to share care/food packages to villagers that were most affected. We are also thankful to some of the local government units who also helped the people. After Karding, typhoon “Paeng” ravaged the Philippines leaving in its wake at least 72 people dead, 33 injured, and 18 others missing, proving to be relentless in pounding Southern Luzon with heavy rains and punishing winds while extending its reach up to Visayas and Mindanao. Landslides and heavy flooding were experienced. The Philippine government is still busy helping all in need and planning for the future. As of now, our islands are bracing for the next typhoon, “Queenie”. Please pray that this typhoon will weaken before it reaches landfall in the Philippines.

Projects like our Normal Emergency Checklist were needed to be finalized and we have also gone through writing our Standard Operations Procedures. He has been a big help in recommending what has worked for them in Samaritan's Purse, but also adapting it for our operation out here in the Pacific. Another area he has been helpful is troubleshooting electrical problems. We have been able to fix an intermittent RADAR problem, a propeller heat problem and several others.
