Dear Praying Friends and Faithful Partners,

"For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith." Romans 1:17

On October 31, so many people will be focused on a celebration which would include candies, costumes and scary movies and such. Here on Guam, offices, stores and homes are already decorated to celebrate this event. For Christians, however, we have something far more significant to celebrate in October. October 31 is Reformation day, which commemorates what was perhaps the greatest move of God's Spirit since the days of the apostles. Initially protesting the pope's attempt to sell salvation, Luther's study of Scripture soon led him to oppose the Church of Rome on issues including the primacy of the Bible over church tradition and the means by which we are found righteous in the sight of God. Salvation is by grace alone through faith alone, and good works result from our faith, they are not added to it as the grounds for our right standing in the Lord's eyes (Eph. 2:8-10). Justification, God's declaration that we are not guilty, forgiven of sin, and righteous in His sight comes because through our faith alone the Father imputes, or reckons to our account, the perfect righteousness of Christ (2 Cor. 5:21). What a freedom we have in Christ! We pray as we live, teach and preach this message of salvation that people will have the freedom to believe and live the Truth of God's Word!

GUAM. We thank God for a day and time during each week, where we (from PMA Mission stations) get together for prayer through Skype. It started off with Sylvia in Pohnpei and me on Guam, and then Heidi on Yap joined us and Sabine in Pohnpei. Since Prisca arrived in Palau, we have asked her to join us. We left the decision on how to handle this with the chiefs from the island. The weekend of the break-in the community had planned a meeting with the chiefs to talk about issues like break-ins and vandalism. The chiefs turned the case over to the government and I want to ask you to pray with me that the right decisions will be made. Five kids were responsible with the youngest being 13 years old, and the oldest one 18. Stealing has been an ongoing problem in the islands. Please pray that our Lord Jesus Christ would use our weekly visits for a Bible study and especially, that our small congregation in Ulithi would make a difference in the life of each individual and the whole community. **From: Simon Hammerling**
