Dear Praying Friends and Faithful Partners,

"It is finished!" One of the most freeing statement Jesus uttered – were these three words. This was the final Word in the redemption of mankind. I was brought up in a religion that taught us to work for our salvation. To try to please God – and maybe, I would end up in heaven one day. But there were no assurances, nor promises. Until one day – the Word of God was revealed to me. The cry on the cross, was a cry of victory! In Greek, the word meant "Tetelestai" - "It is Paid!" On the cross, Jesus paid for my sins and the sins of the whole world! YAP, MICRONESIA. March 27 was when we received news of an impending storm. Then, we were informed that Guam would be safe. However, the storm was intensifying and moving west of Chuuk, with the center passing over Weno by Sunday. Maysak caused significant damage to Chuuk. Many tin-roof homes were damaged or destroyed. Some power poles were knocked down. Power is likely still out across much of Weno and communications are slowly coming back online. Many fruit plants and trees were damaged or knocked down likely causing short term food shortages for some. As Maysak continued on its track northward - it was also intensifying into super typhoon – moving toward Yap and the outer-islands of Chuuk and Yap. By Tuesday, March 31 – it was clear that Ulithi and Fais were on its path and now it was packing 160 mph wind. The following day, I spoke to our Director of Flight Operations/Chief Pilot, Amos Collins and the report was not good. The island was ravaged. (Please check our FB page for more details.) The following day, with the weather clearing up and an assurance that the airstrip in Ulithi was cleared for landing, Amos took off with an assessment team from IOM and the Yap state government. He also took sacks of rice, water and food for distribution. PMA will continue to fly out people and relief goods as long as supplies are there – to immediately provide the urgent needs of the island, until off-island help arrives.

GUAM. It was a great surprise when I received a message from Todd Aebischer, that he and wife Connie would be on Guam for a Conference. The Aebischers served with PMA Yap, as missionary pilot from 1992 - 1995. Communication continued through the years since they left PMA and served in many areas of the world. So it was with joy that I looked forward to their visit and for a time that we could get together – get caught up in family news, and the ministry they are involved in. Turns out that Todd is now Asia-Pacific Region Coordinator for his denomination and now we are working together, partnering on occasion for the expansion of the Lord's kingdom. So neat, how God works this all together!

PHILIPPINES. "We thank God for safety and protection as we all travelled to Patnanungan island on March 25. This was to celebrate with the children, their parents, and PMA staff on the 12^{th} Moving Up and Recognition day of our PMA Academy. 25 students graduated that day -11 of them promoted to Grade 1 and the rest would be moving up to Kindergarten. We praise God for 342 children who have gone through our school since we started! May our students continue to grow in the knowledge, wisdom and love of our Lord Jesus Christ."
