YAP, MICRONESIA. The last Saturday of January, we had a charter flight by IOM to go to Ulithi and see the progress of the reconstruction (after the onslaught of Typhoon Maysak), and also to plan for the drought that is expected this summer due to El Nino. Simon took the flight and was supposed to have only 4 hours ground time which turned into 6 hours.

Meanwhile back in Yap at around 1:30 PM a flatbed truck brought Kayla over, an 18 year old girl from the west side of Yap, and her skull was fractured. Immediately after she was assessed at the hospital, we were called to do a medevac to Palau, where they could do a CAT scan.

Grace and I contacted our Base in Palau and Stephan made phone calls to get us our landing permit, and to get approval from immigration for the patient to enter without a passport. Everything came together at about 5 PM. Simon returned, we refueled, the family came, the patient came, and we were taxying out of Yap by 6:30 PM.

Stephan told me that an airliner was landing 30 minutes before us and then 30 minutes after us, so we needed to arrive there at 7:00 PM Palau time. It all worked out perfectly. Thank you Lord!

After we landed in Palau and the ambulance picked up Kayla, I went to clear paperwork with Immigration and Customs, and then when we were ready to leave, the airport didn't allow us to take-off because the other plane was delayed in arriving. So we had to wait an additional 30 minutes for it to land and get cleared. We departed Palau just after 10:00 PM (Yap Time) and landed in Yap at 11:45. Our whole crew was there waiting and we closed up just after midnight, tired but very thankful that we could be of service to someone once again. Praise the Lord! By: Amos Collins

According to the relatives, she has no fractures, just a lot of bruises. The CT scan showed internal bleeding in the head, the opposite side where she got hit. The doctors are monitoring the internal pressure, if it does not rise they will let the body deal with it, otherwise they will have to do an operation to relieve the pressure. Markus and Prisca Klassen stopped by the hospital Thursday after the first visit. After talking to the relatives, they found that her condition is improving and she is able to eat.
