YAP, MICRONESIA. For the past several months, our hangar space has been in a constant shuffle. Not only are we crammed tight with 4 twin engine aircraft packed into a 60' X 80' space, but we have been handling the incoming and outgoing relief supplies donated to the people of Ulithi after Typhoon Maysak devastated the island in April. One of the biggest challenges for storage space was the five 40' containers of donated school desks, chairs and cabinets. We had to store them for over a month until the Education Department was able to rebuild the destroyed roofs of Ulithi High School. Once that was accomplished, we coordinated with them to book the desks and chairs on the State ship to be transported out. Our hangar crew spent weeks disassembling all the desks to be able to palletize them for shipping. Finally the day came when the Education Department picked up 50 pallets of disassembled desk legs and table tops and sent them to Ulithi on the ship. And then, it just so happened that I had a flight to Ulithi the day after all the desks were unloaded, and I was able to spend the day working with a few eager helpers to assemble the desks. In 8 hours we had assembled over 150 sturdy school desks and set them up in the classrooms, ready for when classes would resume. It was a long day, but I was so happy to be able to see that project complete. The following week Ulithi High School began registering students. God's timing is perfect! -Amos Collins
